This annual report was prepared based on input from Volusia County, the City's floodplain manager and staff from the City's Public Works Department. Activity Section 510 of the CRS Coordinator's Manual requires an annual update of the Plan's implementation status be made available to the local governing body, the community, and the media. It was submitted to City Council via email correspondence, it was released to the media and it was made available to the public by a posting on the City's Flood Preparedness website (link listed above).

Recommendation	Implementation Description
<p>❶ Develop a Program for Public Information (PPI) in accordance with guidance provided in the Community Rating System Coordinator's Manual, 2017 edition.</p>	<p>Initial meetings of the PPI Committee were held in March and June of 2016. The Committee established public outreach goals and developed a flood information brochure that has been distributed throughout the City. The PPI Committee met again March 30, 2018, March 20, 2019, March 23, 2020, and February 24, 2022 to discuss PPI status and to discuss ways to improve public outreach.</p>
<p>❷ Provide advice and assistance to property owners concerning the protection of their properties from flooding, local drainage, and sewer back-up problems.</p>	<p>Information is available and is provided to property owners directly by City of Deltona staff, mail-outs, and the City website.</p>
<p>❸ Continue the flood hazard mitigation program to identify and obtain funding for both pre-and-post disaster residential mitigation projects.</p>	<p>The City of Deltona Public Works Department continues to identify cost beneficial residential units for various flood mitigation grants. Currently, there are 6 repetitive flood loss properties located within City of Deltona jurisdiction that can benefit from flood mitigation grant funding.</p>
<p>❹ Prioritize capital projects that will mitigate flood impacts in those areas of the City that have experienced significant flooding problems.</p>	<p>Stormwater and drainage system improvement projects continue to be implemented on a regular basis by the Public Works Department.</p>
<p>❺ Utilize "Volusia Prepares" countywide Local Mitigation Strategy to guide and assist the City in establishing priorities for flood hazard mitigation projects.</p>	<p>The LMS Steering Committee meets quarterly to review and prioritize mitigation initiatives and identify potential funding sources for flood impact reduction projects.</p>
<p>❻ Review the locations and effects on areas that experience flooding and determine what steps, if any, the City can take to alleviate future impacts.</p>	<p>Public Works conducts regular inspections of flood prone areas within City limits to determine the best and most cost-effective mitigation activities.</p>

4. Discuss why any objectives were not reached or why implementation is behind schedule:

All objectives are being reached. Implementation is somewhat behind schedule due to lack of grant funding to assist cover project costs.

5. What are the recommendations for new projects or revised recommendations?

Since the Program for Public Information (PPI) has already been developed, a recommendation would be to revise Goal 1 with the deletion of "Develop" and addition of "Continually enhance the Program for Public Information".
