Dear Mr. Casey,

This letter is provided in response to your email dated May 16, 2024, requesting confirmation the county has adequate water, wastewater, and reclaimed capacity to serve the subject development.

Please be advised the subject property is located within Volusia County's utility service area. Volusia County maintains a 12" dia. water main located along the south side of Howland Blvd. adjacent to the subject property and a 6" dia. gravity sewer main located along the north side of Howland Blvd. adjacent to the subject property. Additionally, there is an 8" dia. water main that runs from the south side of Howland to the north side at the adjacent parcel.

Volusia County owns and operates a 1.5 million gallon per day (MGD) water treatment and transmission system providing water supply service to the subject area. The county has adequate water capacity to serve the subject development.

Volusia County owns and operates a 0.6 MGD wastewater collection system and treatment facility providing wastewater service to the subject area. The county has adequate wastewater capacity to serve the subject development.

Water and wastewater capacity may be reserved in the county's utility system upon payment of the utility development fees. The county's utility development fee schedule is available online at www.volusia.org.
